- Good initiative in approaching potential subjects in small, independent stores which
 offer both a better chance of getting permission to shoot as well as more time with
 each subject when making the portraits.
- Don't worry too much about the mistakes these are areas for future improvement. The point of this assignment is to get out there with the camera and explore your own identity as a photographer through your relationships with unfamiliar subjects.
- I'm not sure I agree that the vape and music store images aren't identifiable, but I agree the technical issues may preclude them (focus especially, exposure, it depends how much you can rescue the shot in post).
- I would have rejected the takeaway image because of the crop more than anything.
- You don't have to be too literal with the background. Viewers can work a lot out for themselves with relatively minor clues, especially if it is something they are familiar with (or not, as in the Vape shop guy as I know nothing about vaping).
- Captions do the subjects have names? Why have you not recorded them?
- Lighting bounce flash would have solved some of your issues (camera shake and the direction of the lighting). You can hold a flash of to one side and shoot, and even hold it off to one side and have reflector placed on the opposite side to balance the light even more.
